**LISTENING TASK 1    READING 1**

Gentlemen,

I'd like to brief you on the sharpshooters' competition organised by the German Battle Group. The competition was organised at the Kalinovik Firing Range on the seventeenth of April.

The main goal of the competition was to improve cooperation in SFOR. The main task of the organisers was to get all information from the different battle groups in order to match the number of competitors.

The organisers invited all SFOR contingents. However, three teams later cancelled their participation and only the Canadian, French, Italian, and the German sniper teams were able to participate.

The competitors gathered the night before the competition, in Camp Filiopovic. They planned to arrive there by helicopter but due to the bad weather conditions, they had to come in an armoured bus.

The organisers tried to provide additional entertainment for the competitors, like weapons demonstrations, in which they displayed the standard weapons used by the German Battle Group.

The competition for the sharpshooters consisted of three different events. In the first exercise, each participant got eight cartridges, and, without a time limit, fired at five targets placed at different ranges.

The second exercise was a pistol firing exercise which began with a qualifying round where they shot at a balloon. Each sharpshooter got fifteen cartridges. The range to the target was ten to twenty-five metres.

In the last phase, hostage rescue firing, the team had two targets. As soon as they had completed all preparations for firing, the targets appeared at an unknown distance. Then, the team had three minutes to "kill" the targets without injuring the hostage. Two soldiers from each team had to fire one after the other.

All the teams gave their best efforts, sharing their specific knowledge in this top-level competition. The competition was a good opportunity to deepen common understanding in a multinational environment.
